DEPUTATION

Denis Reinhardt, Thomas and Scott Hall attended the meeting at 9.30am to present a deputation on mining in the Etheridge Shire.

Project status (DA approved, pre-construction etc)

The Georgetown Gold mill is the only operable hard rock gold mill north of Charters Towers. Upgrading work is currently underway for the resumption of production in 2016. Currently retreatment of tailings is being tested in bulk samples. There is in excess of 500,000 tonnes of tailings at the Mill available for retreatment.

UNCONFIRMED MINUTES - GENERAL MEETING, 16 DECEMBER 2015

The Mill and significant regional tenements were assembled by Hong Kong investors at a cost of \$29 million, and has been acquired by Brisbane based company, Etheridge Operations Pty Itd (EOPL), under a Deed of Company Arrangement. Etheridge has also reached an agreement with the Hong Kong investors to subordinate their debt.

Etheridge Operations Pty Ltd proposes to lift the capacity of the Georgetown Mill over the next three years, so as to make it economically viable. At previous throughput capability of 100,000tpa it was a high cost mill.

EOPL has recently acquired the mothballed 350,000 tpa Collingwood Tin Mill near Cooktown, and intends to use components from there to upgrade the Georgetown Mill.

Active consideration is being given to increasing the capabilities of the Mill to process sulphide and base metal ores available on The Etheridge.

Detailed work is underway evaluating transport options, including linking the Mill by rail to the current Forsayth railhead.

Project development work continues at the Agate Creek gold project owned by Laneway Resources Ltd, an ASX listed entity. EOPL has funded drilling and exploration agreed to mine and process 200,000 tonnes of high grade gold ore.

Outstanding issues to be considered:

The Mill transitioning to full production

Desired Council support:

Transport approvals

Water supply options – an upgraded mill will be a large water user.

Participation in the Northern Australia Infrastructure Facility (NAIF) particularly to assist mid-stream processing, water supply and transport improvements.

Investor visits

Expected demands on Local Government / State Government infrastructure:

Currently subject to assessment, but not anticipated to be huge in 2016 because significant feed will come from on site tailings and Agate Creek ore.

EOPL expects to develop a comprehensive proposal to put before the Etheridge Shire Council in first quarter 2016.

Expected construction workforce and post construction workforce:

This will be included in 2016 Q1 study.

Desired housing location for permanent workforce

EOPL is showing preference to local and FNQ recruitment, and is not an active supporter of FIFO except for external consultants.

The Mill has rented one house in Georgetown and expects to rent more soon.

Any other consideration that may impact on your project.

EOPL and Mill staff wish to engage in active discussion with the Council and the local community over the ways being considered to build the Mill and associated mines into significant producers, employers and contributors to regional development

Etheridge Shire Planning Scheme Review

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Sustainable Planning Act 2009 requires all local councils to review their planning schemes every 10 years. The Etheridge Shire Planning Scheme was adopted in October 2005 and as such is due for review.

Over the past 18 months council officers have on several occasions discussed with the Department Infrastructure Local Government and Planning (DILGP) proposed "minor" changes to the current planning scheme. However the Department has advised that the proposed changes would be seen as being "substantial" changes and as such would require a total review of the current planning scheme resulting in substantial cost to council considering a further review would be required when the new "Planning Act" comes into existence.

A review of the current planning scheme would need to be aligned with current state planning legislation e.g. Queensland Planning Provision (QPP) and the Sustainable Planning Act (SPA).SPA is now and has been under review by the state government for over 12 months. We are led to believe that a totally new planning act will be proclaimed sometime over the next 12 months.

The current Etheridge Shire Planning Scheme is still suitable and appropriate for future development in the Etheridge Shire.

Scenic Lookout Restoration Fund

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Local Governments can now nominate for funding under the Palaszczuk Government's new \$3 million Scenic Lookout Restoration Fund. The fund was set up to help local councils revitalise existing lookouts and to encourage tourism in Queensland by improving safety, accessibility and amenity on our road network.

Sites will be focused on existing formal scenic lookout facilities on both state controlled and local government road networks

- nominations for sites on local government-controlled roads will be managed under established Regional Roads and Transport Groups (RRTG) processes and will require RRTG endorsement to progress;
- state funding will be capped at \$300,000 per site to maximise the benefits across the state;
- funding of sites on local government-controlled roads will be on a 50:50 state to local government funding basis;
- nominations are due to your local Department of Transport and Main Roads' Regional Director by 8 January 2016. An approved program is currently expected to be finalised in the first quarter of 2016.

DA2011-002 – Permissible Change to Application

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

On 19 February 2014 council approved with conditions an application for a wind farm located between Forsayth and Einasleigh. This wind farm was later to be known as the Forsayth Wind Farm. Council is now in receipt of a request for a Permissible Change to this Development Approval.

In summary the Permissible Change seeks to change the existing layout of the wind turbines, total number of turbines, increase permissible internal access road widths, remove the requirement to bitumen seal specific roadways and remove the requirement as a council condition the inclusion of concurrence, advice and third party conditions and advice.

The Department Natural Resources and Mines (DNRM), Queensland Rail (QR) and Department Transport and Main Roads (DTMR) have assessed the proposed changes and have provided no objection to the changes and have not required further referral.

The request for the Permissible Change is recommended subject to relevant amendments of original conditions.

1) Condition 1 states:

"the development shall be undertaken generally in accordance with the approved drawings and/or documents and in accordance with the specifications, facts and circumstances as set out in the application and subsequent amendments (Gilvear Planning Ref:J000149:FWF:SR – 13/02/2014) submitted to Council. (Refer Appendix 5 – Site Location and Indicative Turbine Layout Plans)"

Given the proposed changes to the layout request to amend Condition 1 as follows-"the development shall be undertaken generally in accordance with the approved drawings and/or documents and in accordance with the specifications, facts and circumstances as set out in the application and subsequent amendments (Gilvear Planning Ref:J000149:FWF:SR – 13/02/2014) 09/11/2015 submitted to Council and as shown on Catcon drawing WAD131099 C04 dated 16/09/15. (Refer Appendix 5 – Site Location and Indicative Turbine Layout Plans)"

It is recommended that council resolve to approve Condition 1 in this amended format.

2) Condition 9 states:

"Internal access roads shall be designed and located to have a maximum cleared width of 7m within the remnant vegetation, to avoid any natural drainage lines, to have low-impact, environmentally sensitive drainage and to require minimal maintenance"

Due to the topography of the site and nature of the use greater flexibility to provide for the establishment of larger tracks is necessary to ensure the safety and efficiency of construction and ongoing operation and maintenance of the development. It is requested that Condition 9 be amended as follows:

"Internal access roads shall be designed and located to have a maximum cleared width of **7m-up to10m** within the remnant vegetation, to avoid any natural drainage lines, to have low-impact, environmentally sensitive drainage and to require minimal maintenance"

It is recommended that council resolve to approve Condition 9 in this amended format.

3) Condition 12 states:

" The road shall be bitumen sealed for the full length of the frontage of the Einasleigh – Forsayth Road and associated access road intersections"

The applicant has requested through representations that this condition be deleted due to access to the wind turbines through the new layout will not impact on council roads.

It is recommended that despite representations by the applicant council resolve to decline this request and retain Condition 12 as noted above.

4) Condition 31 states:

"The concurrence, advice and third party agency conditions provided by DERM, DTMR and Ergon Energy within Appendices 1, 2, 3 & 4 shall be included as conditions of this approval."

These issues have been addressed by the applicant separately with the appropriate department.

It is recommended that council resolve to approve the removal of any third party advice (wetlands and other matters) included within the letter dated 22 December 2011, and included as Appendix 3 in the original Decision Notice.

And furthermore all other conditions of the Decision Notice dated 25 February 2014 remain unchanged.

Etheridge Shire Rural Road Network

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

An extensive investigation has been undertaken to confirm/correlate all rural road names within the Etheridge Shire boundary with records held by the Department of Natural Resources and Mines (DNRM). The need for this investigation became apparent after queries by the Queensland Reconstruction Authority (QRA) regarding road names and asset numbers. The QRA sources road identification data from DNRM.

Presently Council records (Council Road Register ref doc A) provide names for some roads which are different to that recorded by DNRM. Additionally within the townships of Forsayth, Mt Surprise and Einasleigh the DNRM records indicate roads and names which are non-existent in the Council Road Register.

The above and other "deficiencies" such as; incorrect road names, obsolete roads within the townships of Charleston, Goldsmith and Einasleigh, changed road names due to separation or splitting of grazing properties, and local/colloquial road names replacing the names detailed in the DNRM register have been identified by Mr Rob Duffy (Business Manager, Landcentre, Land and Spatial Information, Department of Nature Resources and Mines, Brisbane). As advised by DNRM an updated road register needs to be lodged with the department as gazetting of Local Government roads are no longer required.

Under the Land Act 2009 Council has the authority to change the name of a road and in keeping with the Queensland Naming Policy the recommended changes are as detailed in the "new" road register which will replace the current Register held by Council.

The amendments recommended will remove any confusion and help maintain a more correct register of names for roads which the QRA is supportive.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

A request calling for an Expression of Interest to Supply and Deliver Diesel Fuel to Etheridge Shire Depot and a mobile tanker located within the Shire was advertised in August 2015 with the objectives being to streamline Council's fuel procurement process and reduce related procurement costs for Council.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Tenders were invited for the Register of Preferred Suppliers for Wet and Dry Hire of Plant and Equipment from 29 March 2016 to 28 March 2017 with the option to extend the period a further twelve (12) months if so decided by Council.

At the close of tender, 19 October 2015, sixty (60) submissions were received. One Tender was considered to be non-compliant as Form C (Submission of Prices) was not completed.

Assessment of the Tenders has been within the guidelines of the Council Procurement Policy and Legislation, namely: Local Government Act Qld 2009 S.106 (3) in respect of sound contracting principles with a register of preferred suppliers to be maintained by Council in accordance with the Local Government Regulation 2012 sections 233.

Importantly Council needs to note that the table of registered Preferred Suppliers is not in any specific order and is only a "register" of suppliers under the Tender. It DOES NOT provide guarantee of work by Council.

The selection of a Tenderer will be governed by the sound contracting principles referred to above and requirements on the day for the work including the suitability of the subject plant and equipment.

Council is to kindly note that the engagement of any Contractor maintained on the preferred list will be subject to stringent conditions in accordance with the Tender Conditions and Specifications, These conditions are:

- Possession of current licenses, registration certificates, insurance policies as applicable, public liability and workers compensation cover, condition of the equipment <u>WHEN</u> <u>REQUIRED</u> to commence work.
- Availability of plant and machinery at the time when required.
- Experiences and capabilities of the operators which will reflect on the performance and adherence to Council Policies and Procedures with special reference to the Council's and Legislated Code of Conduct.
