MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Hello and welcome to this months report



With the festive season behind us Council is now back in full swing (weather pending).

As at the 29th of January, Council will go into caretaker mode for the upcoming Local Government elections to run its course. The January Council meeting is the last opportunity for Council to make decisions, virtually limiting Councils ability to be in management mode only for the period of the election. I would like to acknowledge Cr. Gallagher's contribution to the Etheridge community in his term as Councillor and thank him for the years of commitment to those he represented and to his community.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the Mayor and Councillors for their dedication to their roles and responsibilities, whilst representing their community in the most diligent and respectful way over the last four years.

I also send a big shout out to the gardening crew in Georgetown and town maintenance staff in the smaller communities who do a fantastic job throughout the year but more so over the wet season keeping pace with the growing season and staying on top of a challenging component of Councils duties. The foreshadowed monsoon season will again throw up challenges for Council and contractors but as we always do we will find ways to work around those challenges when they present. There is still much to do to complete the current Flood Damage Project within the prescribed timeframe, and yes there will be rain interrupted periods along the way but Councils resolve is to complete as per schedule.

Ms Allison Smith, CEO of Local Government Association Queensland (LGAQ), Mayor Mark Jamenson, President of LGAQ visited the Etheridge Shire on the 22nd January and will hold discussions with Council central to topics impacting on Council operations. LGAQ is pivotal to local government as a peak advocacy body and to have them drive into Georgetown for a visit is certainly appreciated by Council.

Once again it's that time of the year where the youngest of our community members are off on one of the biggest journeys of their life as the new school year looms very close. Council wishes you all well in your endeavours for the future especially those who move onto secondary school and those who are contemplating career choices as you near the end of your school journey.

I recently travelled to Townsville with the Mayor on the 17th January to be present at the major announcement by the Federal Agriculture Minister, The Honourable Murray Watt and Premier Steven Miles relating to the repurposing of a \$210,000,000 Resilience and Recovery funding package for North and North West Queensland This money was underspent in the 2019 Monsoon Event and Council have been diligently advocating for the distribution of these funds to the affected Shires along with CEO of North West ROC Greg Hoffman. The following press conference saw Federal Ag Minister and Queensland Premier Steven Miles in Townsville announce Stage 1 of this funding allocation to the value of \$119,000,000. There is a further \$91,000,000 to follow to be distributed across the North and North West region as a Stage 2 allocation. Watch this space for further announcements. The full media release is in this edition of the Inform.

Council has considered the challenges associated with road closures and forecast weather models and have had to make the very difficult decision to postpone the Australia Day celebrations in Einasleigh on the 26th January.

This is something that Council did not consider lightly and after much deliberation and respect for both the meaning of what Australia Day stands for and the community of Einasleigh as host of the event a future date will be advised.

We understand that this may be an inconvenience for some but to be fair to the majority Council will now consider a future date for the event.

NORTH WEST QUEENSLAND WELCOMES MUCH-NEEDED FLOOD RECOVERY INVESTMENT



Local government leaders from across North West Queensland have welcomed priority investment for flood recovery and resilience in the region as part of the State and Federal government's \$119 million funding package announced today.

Representatives from the North West Queensland Regional Organisation of Councils (NWQROC) joined Premier Steven Miles and Senator Murray Watt, Federal Minister for Emergency Management in Townsville meeting ahead of the announcement to discuss local recovery investment plans and a second stage package of \$98 million to address the councils impacted by the 2019 Monsoon flooding event.

At the announcement today Senator Watt said: "Local governments have put in a huge effort to help their communities recover and they'll be very much involved in planning where that money is spent.

"Given the scale of the events that we saw, those councils in North West Queensland, which are represented today by their mayors, will be a very key focus in this recovery and resilience package."



"When we have these events, we want to build back better, and that's what this funding is about, so we're more prepared for the future," Senator Watt said.

Representing NWQROC, Etheridge Shire Mayor Barry Hughes said it is most welcome to see that funding priority was the North West which was seriously impacted by flooding events in 2023.



"To be able to stand here today with the support of both State and Federal government, is a huge milestone for helping rural and remote councils right across the North and North West, Mayor Hughes said.

"Councils can start to develop detailed plans and costing for building back better to avoid recurring damage to essential infrastructure and invest in our communities' health and wellbeing."

"It's a great day when the three levels of government can come together when it comes to try to fix the impacts of these weather events. In our case across the North West councils, it dates back to the devastating monsoonal flooding in 2019."



"NWQROC has done a great job advocating for this type of funding to be delivered. To see it come to fruition today is a great day for North West Queensland," he said.

"Whilst we see the normal impact on roads and infrastructure, there are so many other areas that have been impacted. The communities' resilience, health and well-being, connectivity, housing, all those things have been impacted by those massive weather events.



"Speaking with the Minister and Premier earlier on we understand this is a stage one, with further funding in the pipeline and we look forward to working closely to see that come to fruition as well."

"We well and truly recognise that we're just one part of Queensland that has been impacted. We are very appreciative of the type of funding that's being delivered," Mayor Hughes said.

NWQROC is working with the National Emergency Management Agency and Queensland Reconstruction Authority on the details on the development of priorities and program details for the second round of funding focussing on the 2019 flooding event and we look forward to

The Ambulance call centre will contact the Nurse on Shift, while taking your details. It is important when you hang up from the ambulance that you stay off your phone so that the nurse can call you back.



The 1974 Floods

2024 marks 50 years since the devastating 1974 floods. Torrential rain and record breaking floods were a direct result of Tropical Cyclone Wanda, which crossed north of Brisbane. Record flooding occurred in the Bulloo, Paroo middle and lower reaches of the Flinders, Norman, Gilbert, Cooper, Diamantina, Georgina and Eyre rivers and creeks.

A big thank you to Colleen Henry for sending in these historical stories to be shared with everyone in our Shire community.

It is important that we remember our Shire's history and the brave community members who lived through it.

Flood Gilbert River, January 1974 Lake Carlo Station Robert and Kath McFarlane and daughters Robyn Lethbridge and Colleen Henry (both nee McFarlane).

Dad, Mum, Robyn, and I went to Georgetown as Dad cut his foot. While we were in Georgetown the Gilbert River rose and the water went over the bridge. We had a house in Georgetown, we went back and stayed there.

There was a couple of days of heavy rain then it started flooding. By the time of the flooding the rain was clearing.

Strathmore Helicopter flew up to the road now known as Strathmore turnoff but back then was a clear area on the road to Croydon. They picked up Robert McFarlane and Jamesie Johns who had driven out from Georgetown.

They dropped Jamesie at Lake Carlo. The Pilot and Robert flew to Langlovale to check on the caretaker Jock Ludlow. The Langlo River had flooded through the Langlovale house the night before and Jock got up onto the roof of the caravan. Langlovale was Bill and Bonnie McFarlane's home with their family Megan, Susan, David, and Peter (not where the Langlovale house is today). Jock wouldn't leave with them unless they took his little ducks, so they took the ducks too and went back to Lake Carlo.

The Strathmore Helicopter then went back to Strathmore. Robert McFarlane, Jamesie Johns, Bob Wallis and Jock Ludlow were at Lake Carlo for a few days, the water was at the back door of the house. They put things up on 44-gallon drums, but the water rose higher, and drums floated. The water was about 18 inch deep through the house and rising quickly when they shifted out of the house at 3 o'clock in the morning to an old truck they had moved up to higher ground a day or two before. The flood water peaked about 3ft 6in through the Lake Carlo homestead.

They lost radio contact. The helicopter from Strathmore and Bill Harris came checking on them. They airlifted Jock Ludlow and Bill Harris to the area where they were meeting on the road on the Georgetown side of the Gilbert River Bridge. They went back for a second trip to get Bob Wallis, Jamesie Johns and Robert McFarlane. They only had 2 seats and time was running out and they couldn't come back again, Robert said he would stay behind, Jamesie said if Robert was staying so would he. It was suggested that Robert sit on the side, and they strap a rope over his legs and tie him on, so that is what they did, Robert was strapped to the step of the helicopter.

Georgetown policeman, Brian Norris, and a couple of others drove them to Crooked creek - it was too high to cross. They walked over fairly still water backed up from the Gilbert River. Others waiting there drove them to Sandy Creek (old causeway back then no bridge like it is today) where they again walked over the water to Georgetown.

The next day Robert went out with Brian Norris to meet the people from Strathmore. The helicopter ferried Brian and Robert over Crooked creek to vehicles, and they drove down to the Gilbert to pick up 26 Strathmore people to go back to Georgetown, Michael and Toni Rodney and their little 6 month old baby Joanne, Morris and Margaret Gallagher with 2 children of their relatives, Len Forman and his dog, Richie Richardson and others not sure of all their names (some names below).

The Strathmore people had moved out from the homestead and spent the night camped over on a hill before being airlifted out to the meeting place on the Gulf Development Road to get to Georgetown the next day.

More from Michael and Toni Rodney's memory of the 1974 flood below:

Some days later Robert McFarlane, Jamesie Johns and Wayne Beard drove out from Georgetown then walked to the bridge, they climbed over the rubbish on the bridge. The approaches to the bridge out about 800 metres were washed away and the approaches to Pleasant creek were washed away too. They walked to Lake Carlo about 10 km. They then drove back out to Pleasant Creek in Richie Richardson's car and walked back over Gilbert Bridge to their vehicle. A couple of horses were living in the house. A few days later they went back out, walked the bridges, and went back to Lake Carlo and started to clean up. It was weeks before the bridge could be cleared.

Robert thinks Bill and Pat McFarlane might have flown to Langlovale to check things there.

1974 Flood - Memories from Michael and Toni Rodney Strathmore Station

The Strathmore helicopter arrived in the late afternoon, he had to shift approx. 26 people, including 2 kids who were Maurice Gallagher relations including Len's dog.

The helicopter had to land on a 4 wheel trailer as there was water everywhere, we got to the trailer on the dozer. We then went to the nearest hill towards Croydon. The men had to light a fire so that the helicopter could see to land for the last couple of trips.

We stayed there overnight and the next morning we were ferried to the bitumen by two helicopters. One was the Strathmore helicopter flown by Tony McCellan and the second helicopter was from Vanrook flown by Kevin Newman. Then we were ferried to the creek outside Georgetown.

We basically sat at Sandy Creek all day, as there wasn't a strong enough person to row us across. Somebody did have a go but only took some luggage, but he only got halfway across, the boat tipped over and he clung on to a tree in the middle of the creek. It was late in the afternoon when we finally got rowed over Sandy creek.

The stockmen all stayed in the Student Hostel. Mike and Toni stayed at Fred and Marie's. After a week, Mike and a few others went back to Strathmore and started cleaning up. The cold room was full of rotten meat, and all the buildings had had about 3 ft of water through them. Toni and Joanne (who was only a baby - 6 months old) went out to Strathmore a few weeks after the flood. The reason why we were so late being ferried out was we had to wait for the helicopter to come back from Normanton, where it was helping people out there. When the pilot got back to Strathmore, he said our predicament was a lot worse than where he had been. Some of the people that Michael and Toni can remember at Strathmore and Minnie's Station (the out station) at the time of the flood:

Jack Linder and his son Jack. Molly Fleming she was Jack Linder's partner and some others who came from Minnie's. Strathmore people; Jeff Friberg, Grahame Hartwig, Dick Newbury, Tim Grimmond, Bernie Ott, the handyman was Gordon Hammil (he never wore a hat or boots) and Stephen Wilson (Stretch).




