MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

Hello and welcome to the Mayors Report.



During the early days of May a number of meetings were attended by CEO Ken and myself, namely the North West Regional Councils gathering in Hughenden. This provided a great opportunity to traverse the Gregory and Kennedy Development roads and see first-hand the repairs and maintenance works that have been carried out since the wet season. Both these roads copped a flogging over the wet and they are now back to somewhat of an acceptable standard albeit with further works being considered.

Meetings with the Office of Co-ordinator Generals Department, Transport and Main Roads, Genex and Etheridge Shire Council have taken place and continue to evolve around the level of pressure being applied to the Gregory Development Road and the Kidston/Gilberton Road through the Genex Project. Further discussion is programmed to take place with Ministerial visits to the Kidston site and connecting road networks being organised.

Council held a workshop and Special Meeting on Friday 5th of May to consider the final processes relating to the Independent Living Precinct and Council employee accommodation projects. Procurement of housing stocks for both these projects were passed unanimously by Council which means that civil works can now go ahead to prepare the sites.

Council has been guided by the community consultative committee ably chaired by Greg Ryan throughout this process over a long and arduous timeframe to arrive at this point and I congratulate and acknowledge the great work done by these community residents for their commitment and stoic belief that we could bring this project to fruition. I also thank the Councillors and Council staff associated with this project for their support in ensuring that older residents of Etheridge Shire have the opportunity to stay in their community longer with the advent of the independent living facilities.

The State Government has held a full sitting of State Parliament in Cairns this week and I have attended this event.

Etheridge, Croydon, and Carpentaria Shires attended as a regional delegation to discuss with Minister Bailey who holds the Transport and Main Roads portfolio the issues associated with the Gilbert River Bridge and the impact of flooding and road closure during the wet season. We received a good hearing from the Minister and I was able to hold further discussions with his senior staff next morning to pursue the key points raised from the previous day. I am expecting a visit to Etheridge Shire in the very near future from the Director General for Main Roads Mr Neil Scales as a follow up from these discussions.

I was also able to discuss with Minister Bailey the adverse conditions impacting the Gregory Development Road concerning the Genex Project at Kidston.

This road corridor has come sharply into focus as it struggles to contend with heavy traffic volumes and overweight and over mass loadings traversing the sections between the Oasis Roadhouse and Einasleigh. Further discussions are required and we will pursue these important issues with the continuation of support from Genex, Power link, and the Office of the Co-ordinator Generals Department.

Whilst in Cairns I held talks with the Minister for Agriculture, Minister Furner regarding the Etheridge Ag Precinct funding arrangements as a follow up from the discussions previously held in Brisbane at the FNQROC Mayoral delegation in March. Etheridge is working closely with Regional Development Australia in regard to this project.

I was able to take advantage of the full contingent of Parliament being in our back yard and talk to Opposition spokesperson's surrounding policing matters in Etheridge, Local Disaster Management issues, Local member Robbie Katter updates and a broad range of subjects impacting Local Governments.

On the last day of sittings I was able to meet with Minister for Employment, Training and Small Business the Honourable Di Farmer where discussions around sustaining the services of the student hostel took centre stage and a visit to Etheridge for further talks with departmental staff is being organised.

There were also numerous opportunities to catch up with Opposition spokespeople and familiarise them with issues of concern as well as meeting a number of times with Local Member Robbie Katter. All in all a big week but a fruitful one in Cairns.

Deputy Mayor Laurel and I travelled to Croydon on the 16th May to present at the NRM information day. Etheridge was invited to deliver the presentation around carbon positive initiatives being undertaken by Etheridge Shire.

Council held its General Meeting for May on the 17th and all relevant information can be found on Council's web page.

Work is well underway on the GDR to finish the short section on the Talaroo project. Once this has been finalised the road construction crew will move to the new section on the Kennedy Highway to commence the five kilometre bitumen construction project situated at the southern end of the shire.

CEO Ken is taking a short break and his position will be filled by an old friend of Georgetown Mr. Neil Crotty who spent some considerable time here as an employee of Etheridge Shire some 25 years ago. I look forward to working with Neil again and to hear his views on how things have changed here in Etheridge over those years.

Council is pleased to advise that in conjunction with Shepherd Services, all event related damage data has now been collected and is in the submission stage for funding approval. This is forming a critical part in assuring we as a community and Etheridge Shire Council can secure the appropriate funding to its optimum. We wish to thank all Etheredge residents and visitors for their assistance, patience and understanding throughout the damage pick up and data collection stage.

In the coming months as approvals are received, repair works will commence on our road network. We would again and in advance like to thank our community for its support in what will again be a long and at times trying process.

Council has over the past month have been working on emergent works to make the road network safe and trafficable. We ask that all residents and those effected understand that the emergent works are simply a short-term temporary measure to help provide access for all affected by the damage caused by the event.

Etheridge Shire Council continues to seek the assistance of the community to assist in identification of emergency works causing safety and traffic ability concerns in the communities within the Etheridge Shire.

Council asks if you identify a flood related safety or traffic ability concern to utilise the **Snap Send Solve** app on your phone to capture the concern and quickly send it to Etheridge Shire Council to enable work crews to respond to these emergency works as a priority.

Again, we appreciate your patience and assistance during these trying times and ask that you please drive to prevailing road conditions, keeping in mind the crews working on the roads and road conditions themselves.





Influenza Vaccines have arrived for 2023 in Georgetown

The national Influenza program is funded for:

Pregnant Women

Children 6 months – <5years

It is recommended for 65+yrs and younger if you are at increased risk

You are eligible for the vaccine 6 months post COVID infection of COVID booster

Raising awareness of potential invasive weeds

Residents and visitors in Etheridge Shire are asked to be on the lookout for the following species of invasive plants. If further information is needed to identify the suspected weed, please go to https://www.daf.qld.gov.au/business-priorities/biosecurity/invasive-plants-animals/fact-sheets and compare the images and descriptions of confirmed weed species to the suspected weed or download the Weed Spotter app on Google Play Store.

Singapore daisy (Sphagneticola trilobata)

Singapore daisy is a garden escapee and native of tropical America. It prefers moist areas on a range of soil types. If can be found in gardens, parks, bushland, disturbed areas, along roadsides, lawns and footpaths. It is becoming a problem by invading Wetlands, irrigated areas and around drains.





Singapore daisy is present in coastal areas of Queensland.

Singapore daisy is a vigorous ground cover or low climbing plant that forms a mat. The leaves are lush glossy green, usually 3 lobed and in pairs up the stem 4–18 cm long and 1.5–8 cm wide. It produces yellow to orange-yellow daisy flowers about 2 cm. The flowers are held above the leaves on short leaf stalks. Seeds are elongated, brown 4–5 mm long. The amount of seed per flowers varies greatly. Flowers mostly spring to autumn but will flower all year round. Most reproduction is vegetative, from stems nodes & is mainly spread by cuttings via slashing and pruning. As Singapore daisy likes to establish in disturbed areas, pre plan revegetation of the area you are clearing. Take extra care when mowing or slashing around areas planted where Singapore daisy is planted so small fragments are not spread to other locations. It spreads rapidly and smothers seedling, ferns and shrubs and will out-compete them for survival.

Singapore daisy is invading all different environmental areas, even living in sand. Singapore daisy will even grow through lawns if uncontrolled.

Hand pull and dig up runners. The plant will regrow from the smallest cutting so dispose of waste carefully. Either burn waste according to council bylaws or put into a black plastic bag and place in the sun for a few days to kill the plant before putting into the refuse bin. Repeat hand pulling will need to be done as a seed bank may need germinate over a period of time in response to weather events and other activities that disturb the soil in the area. Please see below for herbicide treatment options. Remember to read herbicide labels carefully before use and always use herbicide in accordance with the directions on the label.

Singapore daisy is a category 3 restricted invasive plant under the Biosecurity Act 2014. It must not be given away, sold, or released into the environment. The Act requires everyone to take all reasonable and practical steps to minimise the risks associated with invasive plants under their control. This is called a general biosecurity obligation (GBO).

May 2023 Project Update

Since our previous update, the Kidston Pumped Storage Hydro Project (located at the old Kidston Gold Mine outside of Einasleigh and in the heart of Etheridge Shire) has been "making hay whilst the sun shines". Key developments include:

Wises Dam (Upper Reservoir)

- Completion of the Wises Dam bulk earthworks and commencement of HDPE liner placement on the upstream face.
- Pumping of 28GL of water into Wises Pit has commenced using the 6 x 850kW pumps.



Underground Works

- The powerhouse cavern is progressing well with the construction of the tunnel roof well underway.
- The ventilation shaft (4.1m diameter) has been successfully completed using raise-bore techniques and the machine has now moved to bore the cable shaft.
- Tunnelling of the underground audits and main access tunnel continues.

Genex Power is the 100% owner of the Kidston Clean Energy Hub, in which the 250MW pumped hydro project will supplement the existing 50MW solar farm; and 50% owner of the 258 MW wind farm project expected to start construction next year.



Remote Area Families Service (RAFS) Factsheet

About RAFS and what it provides

The Remote Area Families Service is an Early Childhood program designed to support children and families in rural and remote Queensland and the Barkly Tablelands of the Northern Territory, who live beyond the reach of mainstream services. Our service aims to support parents' needs in relation to the early childhood development and education of their children in rural, remote and isolated areas. The focus of the service is directed at all families with children aged birth to 5 years regardless of their cultural or religious background.

RAFS operates throughout QLD from five bases:

- Charleville
- Emerald (based in Mackay)
- Longreach
- Mt Isa
- North Queensland (based in Mareeba)

Please note: We do not provide a babysitting service during any of our events. RAFS staff are unable to take sole responsibility of children during the play sessions.

Ways to access the service

The early childhood program targets children aged from birth to five years; however, if older siblings wish to participate, they are most welcome. The experiences that are planned for the birth to five year old children are play based and use the Early Years Learning Framework as a point of reference. The team will aim to be a consistent presence in the families and children's lives through a variety of ways. Families can contact the RAFS team and request face-to-face contact any time during the year

Playgroups

RAFS playgroups are an excellent opportunity for families to come together and experience a wide variety of early learning activities. Playgroup allows children to play in a relaxed, informal setting, where they can interact with other children, make choices, explore, share ideas and learn to work cooperatively and independently.

Home Visits

Home visits, as the name suggests, are when a RAFS team visits a family, in their home, at a mutually suitable time. A home visit differs significantly from a playgroup. Spending one on one time with children is an opportunity for the RAFS team to tailor the program exclusively to each child. Sharing time with the whole family, being able to let children take the lead in showing the RAFS team their home, is wonderful for self-esteem and confidence building. Home visits will normally take the form of either a morning or afternoon/overnight visit.

Events

At times RAFS may be able to attend Community group or organization events outside the UnitingCare network. Examples include the Royal Flying Doctor Service and Schools of Distance Education. We do require a written invitation to attend these events, please contact your local RAFS team for more information.

RAFS teams offer guidance and support in the area of early childhood development and parenting by trained and/or experienced field staff. This can be done through:

- Art and craft resources
- Kit boxes and resources
- Newsletters
- Phone and email support
- Information and support packs




