MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR



Hello and Welcome to the Mayors Report.

Our small communities across the shire all produced some fantastic events throughout the year and Mt Surprise fits right on in that space with the launch of the "Banging in the Basalt" extravaganza since the last newsletter. Mt Surprise school children excelled in their presentation of the song, Principal Brooke and staff delivered an excellent result and the community support was spot on.

Well done to all associated with the event as it was a great night and good attendances from far and wide.

Also I would like to acknowledge the "Inaugural Stockman's Challenge" event that took place in Georgetown recently. What was great was that the kids were getting exposure to first class industry leading mentors who were very helpful to all who attended. I attended the first afternoon's activity and was very impressed with the support that was on show and the calibre of horsemanship being displayed. Once again well done to the organisers and I am led to believe this event is here to stay and to grow even bigger and better.

CEO Ken and I travelled to Mt Isa this month to attend the North West Regional Organisation of Councils (NWROC) bi-monthly meeting and Annual General Meeting. Well attended and a good line up of presenters saw for an interesting couple of days in the capital of the North West. This included subjects relating to Regional Energy and Electricity Supply Projects, Updates on the Gravel Pits Saga and Quarry Permits (DAF), Queensland Reconstruction Authority, Queensland Energy and Jobs Plan, Southern Gulf NRM.

Also on the agenda was the North West Region Stakeholder Advisory Committee (SAC) meeting which falls under the auspices of State Development.

The Western Alliance of Councils (WAC) meets in Winton this month and Council will have a presence there through their affiliation with NWROC. Twenty two western councils make up the WAC organisation and provides a great platform to promote and pursue issues impacting on regional and remote councils. A priority issue for Etheridge is the Gravel Pits saga and associated Indigenous Land Use Agreements (ILUA) that need to accompany these permits.

Flood Damage is now gaining momentum as I write, and as Zone 1 nears completion Zone 2 is underway with Zone 5 being prepared for gravel supply and delivery.

Council is receiving good feedback from road users on the quality of works being delivered by the staff in Councils workforce and contractors alike so a big shout out to all involved.

As I close this report to make the printing deadline the Georgetown Rodeo is looming so good luck to the organisers and may your event be a successful one.

Community Update

Council and Shepherd Services are pleased to advise all data collection and funding submissions for the 2023 event have been lodged and are in the approval stage for QRA funding, with Zones 1.1, 1.2,2,3, 5 and 6 already approved with construction works having commenced late June 2023 on Zone 1.1. Works on Zone 1.2 commenced early-mid July.

We are delighted to report that 96% or 481 individual approved flood damage claims having already been completed in Zone 1.1, with the balance forecast for completion by mid-end of September. Zone 1.2 is sitting at 57% completion with 66 individual sites being done.

The coming months will see a significant increase in both council and contract work crews evident across the shire. With the mobilization of camps and equipment in line with the roll out of approvals in Zones 2,3 and 6.

Council again, thanks the shires residents and visitors for their ongoing support and co-operation throughout the process to date and for their patience in the months ahead whilst the reconstruction of damaged roadways is carried out.

Remember that if you identify a safety or trafficability concern to utilise the Snap Send Solve app on your phone to capture the concern and quickly send it to Etheridge Shire Council to enable work crews to respond to these emergency works as a priority. Shepherd Services now have a direct line for the public to contact us on during manned office hours 0459575660.

Once again, we appreciate your patience and assistance during the construction process and ask that you please drive to prevailing road conditions, keeping in mind the crews working on the roads and road conditions themselves.



MEDIA RELEASE – September 2023 Gulf Savannah NRM receives a share in over \$350K grant funding

Gulf Savannah NRM is one of four recipients to have received a share in \$350,000 in funding, thanks to the Tropical North Queensland Drought Resilience Grant Scheme.

Gulf Savannah NRM is partnering with the North Queensland Forestry Hub to explore perceptions and best practice adoption of silvopastoral systems, which combines tree growing with the production of livestock, as a potential strategy for drought resilience in the Northern Gulf.

Gulf Savannah CEO Zoe Williams said silvopastoral systems offers alternative animal feed sources and can provide income diversification for farming enterprises. "We are very interested in exploring the options silvopastoral systems may present for graziers in the Gulf to diversity their traditional grazing businesses and develop a new income stream, while obtaining a variety of co-benefits," said Ms Williams.

"Using trees to mitigate against the impacts of climate extremes and drought would be a win-win situation, sequestering carbon while supporting the grazing industry, which is the backbone of the region's economy. Thanks to TNQ Drought Hub, we will gain a greater understanding of the perceptions of silvopastoral systems among graziers and the wider community in Far North Queensland's Gulf region."

TNQ Drought Hub Director, Professor David Phelps said the new grant funding initiative was open to organisations throughout northern Queensland who had capacity to deliver projects that would improve drought resilience for farms and communities where agriculture is a strong contributor to the economy and society.

"We were looking for great ideas from community groups, not-for-profits, primary producers, and agribusiness that would help the agricultural sector and communities become more drought and climate resilient," said Professor Phelps.

"The projects needed to demonstrate tangible benefits in implementing or accelerating the adoption of new technologies, knowledge sharing, and enhancing the capacity for farms and communities to adopt and sustain these practices and programs. Gulf Savannah NRM's initiative is a prime example of projects and research that are playing a key role in ensuring growth, diversification and drought-resilience is at the forefront of the agricultural industry."




The Geological Survey of Queensland (part of the Department of Resources) will soon be conducting an airborne geophysical survey over parts of the Etheredge Shire Council region (see map below). Flying for this survey will occur from August to October 2023 weather permitting.

The airborne survey will be conducted by a Cessna 208 fixed-wing aircraft flying at approximately 60 metres above the ground along east-west lines approximately 100 metres apart and north-south lines approximately one kilometre apart. The survey uses passive sensors to measure and record natural magnetic and radiometric information about the underlying rocks. Analysis of the data will provide important information on the distribution of rock types and will ultimately lead to a much better understanding of the geology in the area. Similar regional geophysical surveys have been conducted throughout Queensland and Australia.

The survey has been contracted to Xcalibur Aviation, who is a reputable and experienced airborne geophysics company. As the survey progresses, Xcalibur Aviation will be contacting landholders in the vicinity of current survey operations. The call sign for the aircrafts conducting the survey is VH-ZKA and VH-ZKG and pilots will be monitoring local VHF & UHF frequencies.

The clinic phone is diverted afterhours and when the nurse is taking a fatigue break or attending an emergency away from the health centre.

AFTERHOURS YOU WILL BE PROMPTED TO RING 000. SELECT THE OPTION FOR AMBULANCE.

The Ambulance call centre will contact the Nurse on Shift, while taking your details. It is important when you hang up from the ambulance that you stay off your phone so that the nurse can call you back.

Once again, the collection tub on the Post Office counter has been unsealed and all money donated to this charity has been counted and sent to them.



UTREACH PHYSIOTHERAPY

The outreach Physiotherapist visits Mt Surprise, Einasleigh, Forsayth, Georgetown and Croydon on a 3-day trip 5 times each year.

Physiotherapists provide individual assessment and management for a range of conditions including:

Musculoskeletal injuries including fractures and muscle/joint pain

- Balance/walking difficulties/falls prevention
- Recovery after surgery, for example total knee replacement
- Pelvic floor health / return to exercise after pregnancy
- Lung conditions including emphysema and bronchiectasis
- Neurological conditions such as stroke, nerve damage, spinal injury
- Burns

Physiotherapy treatment generally consists of:

- Exercise prescription
- Mobility aid prescription
- Strapping/taping
- Facilitation of correct movement patterns
- Patient and carer education
- Manual therapy

If you think you may benefit from physiotherapy intervention, please discuss with the visiting RFDS Doctor or your local clinic nurse. If indicated, they will send a referral to us to follow up with you at our next visit. There is also Telehealth available where consults can take place via videoconferencing as appropriate.

WHAT IS SOCIAL WORK?

Social Work is an Allied Health Professional Discipline. Social Workers are dedicated to helping people achieve optimum levels of personal and social wellbeing.

This Atherton Hospital Social Work service provides support in the Health setting in the Community - Counselling, Education, Advocacy individual & group settings.

Social Workers can be accessed in the Community setting, and can also be accessed in Rural & Remote Communities via Tele Health/Video conferencing.

Atherton Community Social Work can provide assistance for consumers in the Remote areas accessing -

- Anti- natal care in the Outpatient setting,
- Consumers receiving Chemotherapy in an Outpatient setting,
- Consumers in a Community setting including youth to aged care needs.
- Carer support.
- Palliative care concerns.

Tele Health allows for consumers to have access to services sooner, removes the need to travel to another centre for care and allows interaction with Social Worker in a familiar environment.



Remote Area Families Service (RAFS) Factsheet

About RAFS and what it provides

The Remote Area Families Service is an Early Childhood program designed to support children and families in rural and remote Queensland and the Barkly Tablelands of the Northern Territory, who live beyond the reach of mainstream services. Our service aims to support parents' needs in relation to the early childhood development and education of their children in rural, remote and isolated areas. The focus of the service is directed at all families with children aged birth to 5 years regardless of their cultural or religious background. RAFS operates throughout QLD from five bases:

- Charleville
- Emerald (based in Mackay)
- Longreach
- Mt Isa
- North Queensland (based in Mareeba)

Please note: We do not provide a babysitting service during any of our events. RAFS staff are unable to take sole responsibility of children during the play sessions.

Ways to access the service

The early childhood program targets children aged from birth to five years; however, if older siblings wish to participate, they are most welcome. The experiences that are planned for the birth to five year old children are play based and use the Early Years Learning Framework as a point of reference. The team will aim to be a consistent presence in the families and children's lives through a variety of ways. Families can contact the RAFS team and request face-to-face contact any time during the year

Playgroups

RAFS playgroups are an excellent opportunity for families to come together and experience a wide variety of early learning activities. Playgroup allows children to play in a relaxed, informal setting, where they can interact with other children, make choices, explore, share ideas and learn to work cooperatively and independently.

Home Visits

Home visits, as the name suggests, are when a RAFS team visits a family, in their home, at a mutually suitable time. A home visit differs significantly from a playgroup. Spending one on one time with children is an opportunity for the RAFS team to tailor the program exclusively to each child. Sharing time with the whole family, being able to let children take the lead in showing the RAFS team their home, is wonderful for self-esteem and confidence building. Home visits will normally take the form of either a morning or afternoon/overnight visit.

At times RAFS may be able to attend Community group or organization events outside the UnitingCare network. Examples include the Royal Flying Doctor Service and Schools of Distance Education. We do require a written invitation to attend these events, please contact your local RAFS team for more information.

RAFS teams offer guidance and support in the area of early childhood development and parenting by trained and/or experienced field staff. This can be done through:

- Kit boxes and resources
- Newsletters




